WE ENVISION A FUTURE WHERE:

- Networks of conserved land, clean water, wildlife habitat, working farms, and public access to nature are recognized as vital assets to the economy and quality of place.
- People of all ages are connected to the outdoors and the next generation is inspired to be environmental stewards.

WHAT WE PROTECT FOR THE COMMUNITY:

LAND:

Forever conserve 2,170 acres of farm, meadow and forest lands

WATER

- Protect 21 miles of river, stream, and lake frontage
- Monitor water quality at 40 sites throughout the Presumpscot and Stroudwater River watersheds

WILDLIFE:

- Protect 7 miles of wild brook trout habitat
- Steward the migration of thousands of alewife fish through Mill Brook Preserve
- Protect 50 acres of meadows for pollinators and ground-nesting birds






WHAT WE PROVIDE FOR THE COMMUNITY:

PUBLIC ACCESS

- Maintain 28 miles of forested walking trails across 18 different Preserves
- Coordinate the Sebago to the Sea trail from Standish to Portland
- Provide 4 water access launch points for paddling
- Provide access to 11 miles of rivers and streams for fishing

BUILDING ORGANIZATIONAL SUSTAINABILITY TO INCREASE COMMUNITY IMPACT

EXPENSES FY 2020-2021 - \$184,000



- 32% Stewardship: Land and Wildlife (\$60,000)
- 21% Conservation/Land Protection (\$38,000)
- 19% Community Engagement (\$34,000)
- 12% Supporting Services (\$23,000)
- 10% Water Quality Monitoring (\$18,000)
- 6% Development/Membership (\$11,000)



EXPANDING ACCESS TO NATURE CLOSE TO HOME

Steep Falls Village Preserve in Standish opened in 2021 with 1.5 miles of walking trails. Before the Land Trust conserved this land, Steep Falls had no public access walking trails within six miles of the Village.

Forever conserving 25 acres and protecting 12 acres of meadows for pollinators.









COLLABORATING WITH COMMUNITIES TO PROTECT LAND, WATER, AND WILDLIFE

Lowell Preserve (307 acres) is now forever conserved by the Land Trust while continuing to be owned by the Town of Windham, together collaborating to ensure open space for outdoor recreation and wildlife habitat for generations.

- Protecting 4,000 feet of shoreline along McIntosh Brook, which is identified as wild brook trout habitat by the state.
- Forever conserving 66-acres of wetlands, providing high-quality habitat for species such as spring peepers, spotted salamanders, and leopard frogs.
- Improving the 5-mile trail system this fall in collaboration with a wide variety of trail users.

Lovejoy Farm (58 acres) in Westbrook is now forever conserved as a farm with our partners Maine Farmland Trust. The Lovejoy Farm includes half a mile of shoreline along Mill Brook which is now forever protected.













We supported over 500 families in getting outdoors by:

- Creating three scavenger hunts and fairy/gnome villages that can be accessed year-round at Mill Brook Preserve in Westbrook, Black Brook Preserve in Windham and Hawkes Preserve in Gorham.
- Installing a story walk at Hawkes Preserve in Gorham, with a seasonally rotating story.
